

D) DRT-CEL-2024-004; Guam Real Deal, LLC DBA: Deep Green Guam

Update received via email. As of December 22, 2025, GPA conducted inspection and recommended upgrading the power system. Re-inspection will be scheduled once the upgrades are completed. Upgrade completion date is to be determined. Responsible Official card will expire October 2026.

Corrections made to agenda items on Responsible Officials for Cannabis Establishment License (CEL). Mr. Robeto is for Guam Real Deal and Greenland Farms Responsible Official credential is expired and no new updates.

Question from Chair on application for Greenland Farms lapsing due to no update, and expired RO. Chair inquiring on how long the application has been processing. Compliance Inspector M. Cepeda informed board that the Compliance Branch has attempted contact with Mr. Bisco regarding his RO and CEL application, with no success.

Question from Chair on Blue Wave, Inc on RO credential being expired. M. Cepeda informed board that she had several conversations with Mr. Shintaro. Mr. Shintaro informed her that he would renew his RO credentials, but has not come in. Chair inquired with board on removal of lapsed applications from the CCB agenda, due to continuing to be old business. Chair informed board on consideration for handling applications with no movement and informing the applicants. Due to first encounter with a lapsed application, Chair would like to address the issue in the next CCB meeting. No other questions from the board. Board moved to next agenda item.

V. New Business:

A) Cannabis Industry Regulation Annual Summit (CIRAS) on January 29, 2026 at Central Community Arts Hall, Sinajana, Guam

A. Shelton informed board that the first Cannabis Industry Regulation Annual Summit (CIRAS) will be held on January 29, 2026 at the Central Community Arts Hall in Sinajana, from 8am to 5pm. Attendees of the summit can look at the industry's current regulatory landscape, preview of METRC seed-to sale program, history and development of the Cannabis program and current state of the industry. It is open to the public and interested members; however, space is limited so registration is encouraged. Chair inquired if registration is required. A. Shelton informed board that DPHSS is encouraging registration due to maximum capacity in the center. Link and contact information was provided by DPHSS. Chair also inquired if RO credential holders were notified. A. Shelton informed Chair that DPHSS and DRT have been working together and believed some have already registered. No other questions from board. Board moved to next agenda item.

Chair inquired if confirmation can be made that there are no new applications pending. M. Lizama confirmed that there are no new applications. M. Lizama informed board that the application and licensee numbers are since the stand-up of the industry. M. Cepeda also informed the board that there are no pending applications. Chair inquired with Compliance Branch when the last application was received. M. Cepeda informed the board that February 2025 was the last RO application received. No other questions from the board. Board moved to next agenda item.

B) Bill 245-38 / Roundtable hearing – January 08, 2026

M. Lizama provided update on bill 245-38. Draft legislation seeks to extend the sunset period for laboratory testing. Several items were raised during the hearing, once being the CCB has not met since the year prior. One comment made by a participant that he was not aware of the meeting, however, DRT does have the publication and notes from that previous meeting. M. Lizama informed the members during the roundtable that the CCB did not meet, due to having no progress. The consensus from the roundtable was there should still be meeting despite no progress. Other items discussed were the updating of the website to include the meeting minutes that were reviewed and approved by the CCB. Discussion of the participation of CCB members and membership that was lacking. M. Lizama corrected that it should have been two positions to be filled, not three.



Another individual had been sworn in, Jenei Adame-Aguon, and the one position that needs to be filled is the individual holding a medicinal card credential. A suggestion was made by Chelsa Muna / DOAG Director, to have a working session, which would include an educational campaign. Information on the working session is forthcoming.

A. Shelton also informed that another concern during the roundtable was addressing and updating rules and regulations with concerns of the public. Senators introduced a bill after the roundtable, that just went through public hearing. Chair inquired on the public hearing for the bill. A. Shelton informed the board that it was a bill by Senator Sabrina Salas-Matanane to update some rules and regulations. DPHSS testified that they do not hold a position in regard to the bill or have an issue with the content of what is being updated. One concern was the changes being made to the GAR and due to past experience with other bills, DPHSS suggested to have the bill codified in a different way, since a board exists. DPHSS inquired if allowance of the CCB could make the changes to the rules and regulations, however understood the urgency of the bill, due to the CCB having not met. Stakeholders were also in attendance to lobby for the changes to the GAR.

Chair to note that the CCB has not received an application since February 2025 and the difficulties of having a meeting to take action when there is no action to take. Chair would like CCB to consider making changes at the next board meeting to present and move through the administrative adjudication process. Chair discussed when the rules were first introduced and received feedback. A concern was it would be difficult to scale back regulations, as opposed to starting with minimal structure and adding and developing as we go. Chair would like to review for the next CCB meeting and look at changes. Post summit should provide more feedback, discussion and collaboration.

VIII. Next Cannabis Board Meeting:

Discussion from board to have meetings on Wednesdays. February 18 or February 25 dates to be held by board members until confirmation.

IX. Open Forum / Public Comment:

Senator Sabrina Salas-Matanane / Committee Chair on Health and Veterans Affairs and oversight chair on cannabis and hemp rules and regulations. Meetings were conducted with several individuals in the industry, which came up with bill 245. Bill 245 removes the restrictive cannabis-specific farming requirements than those imposed on agricultural crops. Bill 245 treats cannabis cultivation as an agricultural activity, while maintaining health, safety, pesticide and compliance standards. The bill also reduces regulatory barriers that have prevented local farmers from entering the industry. A

medical cannabis cardholder was also acquired to fulfill the last vacant position of the CCB and is just pending the appropriate documents.

Guam Real Deal Responsible Official; Mr. Roberto informed the board that they have renewed and are current with their credentials. Mr. Roberto also informed the board they are still active in the CEL process and have been working with the Compliance Branch with providing updates. Update provided are pending a power upgrade job order from GPA. DPW and GEPA are closely behind as well, and are projecting approximately forty-five days from submitting their CEL application. Mr. Roberto informed the board that he is also in support of Bill 245 and the CCB. Mr. Roberto informed the board that meeting on a regular basis, with or without agenda items, would help to know that there is movement in the right direction. No further comments presented. No questions from the board. Board moved to next agenda item.

M. Lizama moved to adjourn the meeting at approximately 10:40 AM. Motion passed unanimously.

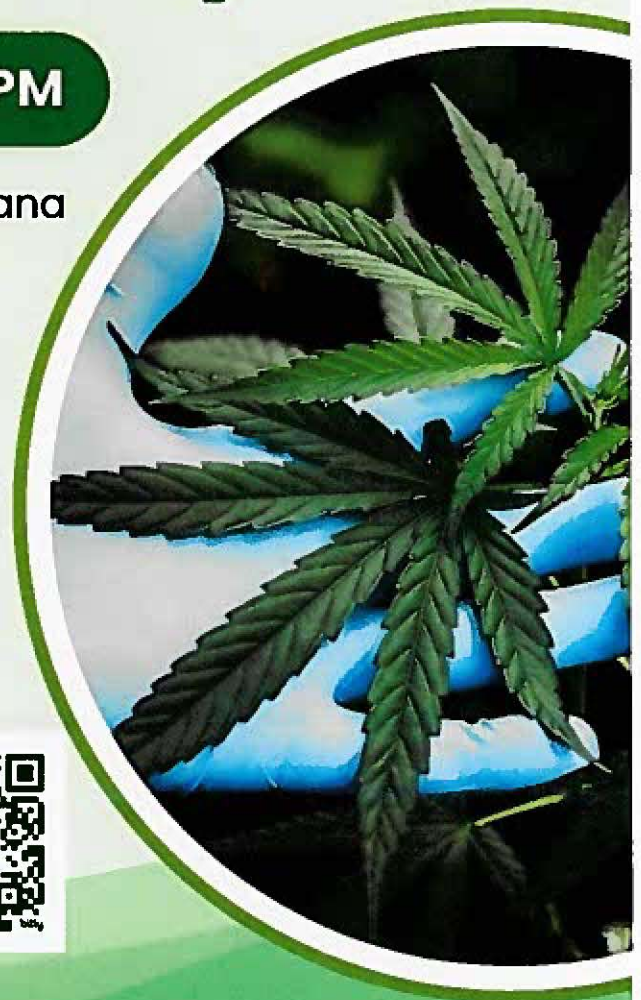

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW 37-116, RELATIVE TO EXTENDING THE SUNSET PROVISION FOR THE TEMPORARY EXEMPTION OF CANNABIS LABORATORY TESTING REQUIREMENTS FROM TWO (2) YEARS TO FIVE (5) YEARS AFTER THE DATE OF ENACTMENT.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings & intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that
3 Public Law 37-116, enacted on July 22, 2024, amended Chapter 8, Division 1, Title
4 11, Guam Code Annotated, to temporarily exempt cannabis businesses from certain
5 laboratory testing requirements under the Guam Cannabis Industry Act. This
6 exemption was intended to allow the cannabis industry to commence operations in
7 the absence of a licensed testing facility that meets the standards of ISO 17025
8 accreditation or certification by the Americans for Safe Access Patient Focused
9 Certification Program.

10 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that, despite the enactment of Public Law
11 37-116 and the passage of over one (1) year, no cannabis testing facility has been
12 licensed or opened on Guam that satisfies these requirements. While the temporary
13 exemption has facilitated initial steps toward establishing cultivation and sales, the

1 perceived lack of a compliant testing facility may be hindering full market
2 development and investor confidence.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that Guam's only cannabis testing
4 laboratory applicant, cultivation facility applicants and retail applicants have faced
5 issues with obtaining clearances from stakeholder agencies needed for full licensure.
6 These hurdles, stem from misunderstandings in rules and hesitancy to commit to
7 binding contracts and expenses without certainty on facility qualifications. This
8 persistent clog hinders the progress in establishing the industry's needed
9 infrastructure.

10 It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to extend the sunset
11 provision in Section 3 of Public Law 37-116 from two (2) years to five (5) years
12 after the date of enactment to provide additional time for a licensed testing facility
13 to emerge. This extension balances the benefits of consumer safety through eventual
14 laboratory testing with the practical need to foster industry growth.

15 **Section 2.** Section 3 of Public Law 37-116 is hereby amended to read:
16 "Section 8108(a)(7) of Chapter 8, Division 1, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, shall
17 be effective ninety (90) days after enactment. Section 8108(a)(7) of Chapter 8,
18 Division 1, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, shall sunset ~~two (2)~~ five (5) years after
19 the date of enactment."

20 **Section 3. Effective Date.** The provisions of this Act shall become effective
21 immediately upon enactment.
